

Greetings Freedom!

My name is Alesha Dobbe, and I am the new 6th-9th grade math interventionist and instructional coach at Freedom Area School District. I wanted to take a minute to introduce myself and explain my new role in the district! I am originally from Antigo, WI but now reside in Clintonville with my husband, Chad, and our three small children, Macgregor (3.5), Callahan (2), and Lucille (1). I have two older siblings, a brother Walker Flannery (orthopedic surgeon at OSMS DePere) and sister Stacey Conradt (6th grade English teacher Clintonville), and one



younger brother Ivan Flannery (self-employed forrester Antigo). My parents still reside in Antigo and my mother is a retired 5th grade teacher and my father is the owner of Flannery & Flannery Logging and Flannery Bros. Trucking. I enjoy spending time with my family outdoors, athletics and sports of all kinds, and reading all the fictional stories I can! The two strongest passions in my life are family and education.

I am a 2013 graduate from the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh where I studied Secondary Education-Mathematics. I am coming up on my tenth year teaching math! Time truly has flown by since my student teaching days at Appleton North & Appleton East High Schools as well as Maplewood Middle School in Menasha. Lakeland Union High School hired me for my first full time math teaching position teaching Algebra and providing math interventions for freshmen. I taught summer school in Lac du Flambeau for the middle school ages before taking a new position at Clintonville High School for the 2014-2015 school year. I continued my education through UW-Madison in 2016 and completed a masters degree in Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis. It was in Madison that I earned my principal and curriculum and instruction licensures and decided to begin exploring roles that influence math education beyond the classroom.

During my 8 years teaching Algebra, Geometry and Algebra 2 at CHS, I designed and implemented various math interventions and enhancement courses. I have a passion for educating young minds, and specifically, helping students learn to love and understand math. I am coming to Freedom Area School District with a deep understanding of the progression of math concepts, and a plethora of experience trying instructional strategies to make math easier for students to comprehend. My goal for my time at FASD is to assist students in their math education journeys; whether that be by providing intervention services to bridge learning gaps, or enrichment opportunities for students to deepen their understanding of math concepts and develop problem solving and higher level thinking skills. I want to be a resource for math instructional staff, students and families, to ensure academic success in Freedom.

I will be providing math services for all students grades 6-9 during study halls and Irish Hour. My classroom is located in the old computer lab off of the library in the 8th grade wing, Rm 142. News from Sixth Grade

In 6th Grade Social Studies, we have been learning about the Sumerian civilization which rose to power in Mesopotamia (The land between the rivers). The Sumerians were known to have invented the wheel and the plow, they made bronze tools and weapons, and they used a number system based on 60. We also learned about other cultures that controlled Mesopotamia through the years, such as the Hittites, Assyrians, Chaldeans, and Persians. Each culture developed new innovations in the areas of irrigation and architecture, art, road building, ship building, and the creation of new laws as revealed in Hammurabi's Code. The Phoenicians were credited for spreading the idea of using an alphabet, which has had a great impact on our culture today.

7th grade

In seventh grade ELA, students will be working on finishing our class novel: The Watsons Go to Birmingham: 1963. In addition, we will continue grammar work with Patterns of Power along with weekly word work. Students will do the December Book Project upon return from the holiday break.

Quarter 2 science focuses on physical science. We will be taking a look at kinetic energy and different potential energies as well as how energy transfers from one object to another and from one type of energy to another.

Students in 7th grade math recently completed unit 1 on proportional relationships. We wrapped up the unit with an escape room allowing students to apply some of their recently acquired skills to help them escape. We now are entering unit 2 which is focused on rational numbers. We are currently working on integers. The students seem to have a really good understanding of real world situations that involve positive and negative numbers. I think we can attribute this knowledge to all of our cold winters in Wisconsin.





Last month in social studies, students worked on making Veteran's Day cards for local veterans as well as those in our state veteran's home in King, Wisconsin. Much of December in social studies will be devoted to working on students' chosen NHD topic.

8th grade

Throughout the first semester of Math 8, we have been and will continue to learn about Geometry topics. Students started the year with a Geometry Readiness Unit that prepared them for the geometry units to come. The Geometry lessons are from the second half of our book so we started with Chapter Five. In Chapter Five we learned all about lines, angles, and triangles. In this chapter, Math 8 students learned that the three angles of a triangle add up to 180 degrees. They also learned to use the Pythagorean Theorem to find a missing side length of a right triangle. In Chapter Six, students learned all about Transformations in the coordinate plane. We learned to slide, flip, and rotate different shapes around the coordinate plane. Students used their skills to create their own logo using transformations. Finally, we learned about congruent and similar figures in Chapter 7. Congruent figures are the same shape and size while similar figures have the same shape, but a different size.

It has been a busy start of the year for 8th grade Algebra students. We've already learned and assessed four chapters! In Chapter One, we talked about expressions, the order of operations, the distributive property, and functions. Chapter Two was all about solving equations in one variable. We learned how to manipulate an equation to solve for an unknown value. We even learned that sometimes there is no answer! In Chapters Three and Four, students explored equations that have two variables called linear equations. Algebra students learned to graph lines and write the equations of lines in different forms. They even used these new skills to plan their own amusement park.
