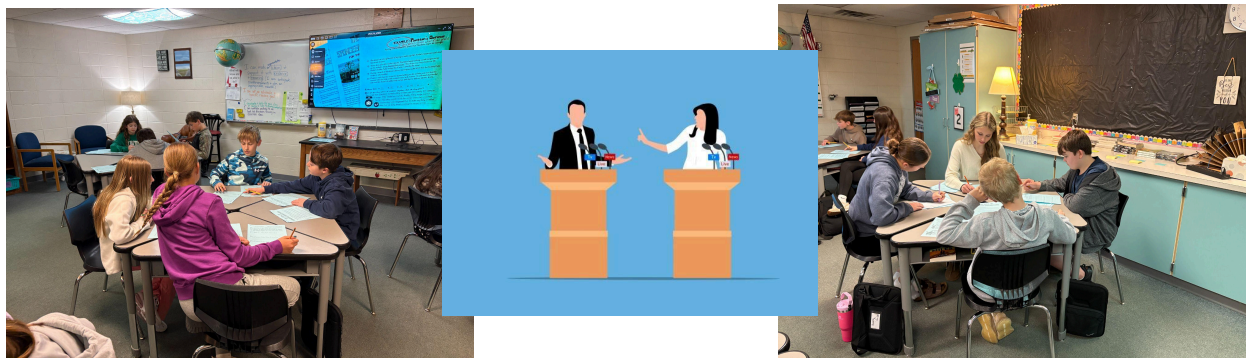

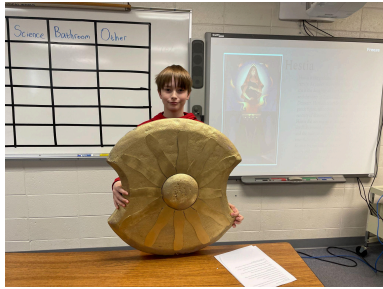

In Social Studies: The students presented their Greek Projects:



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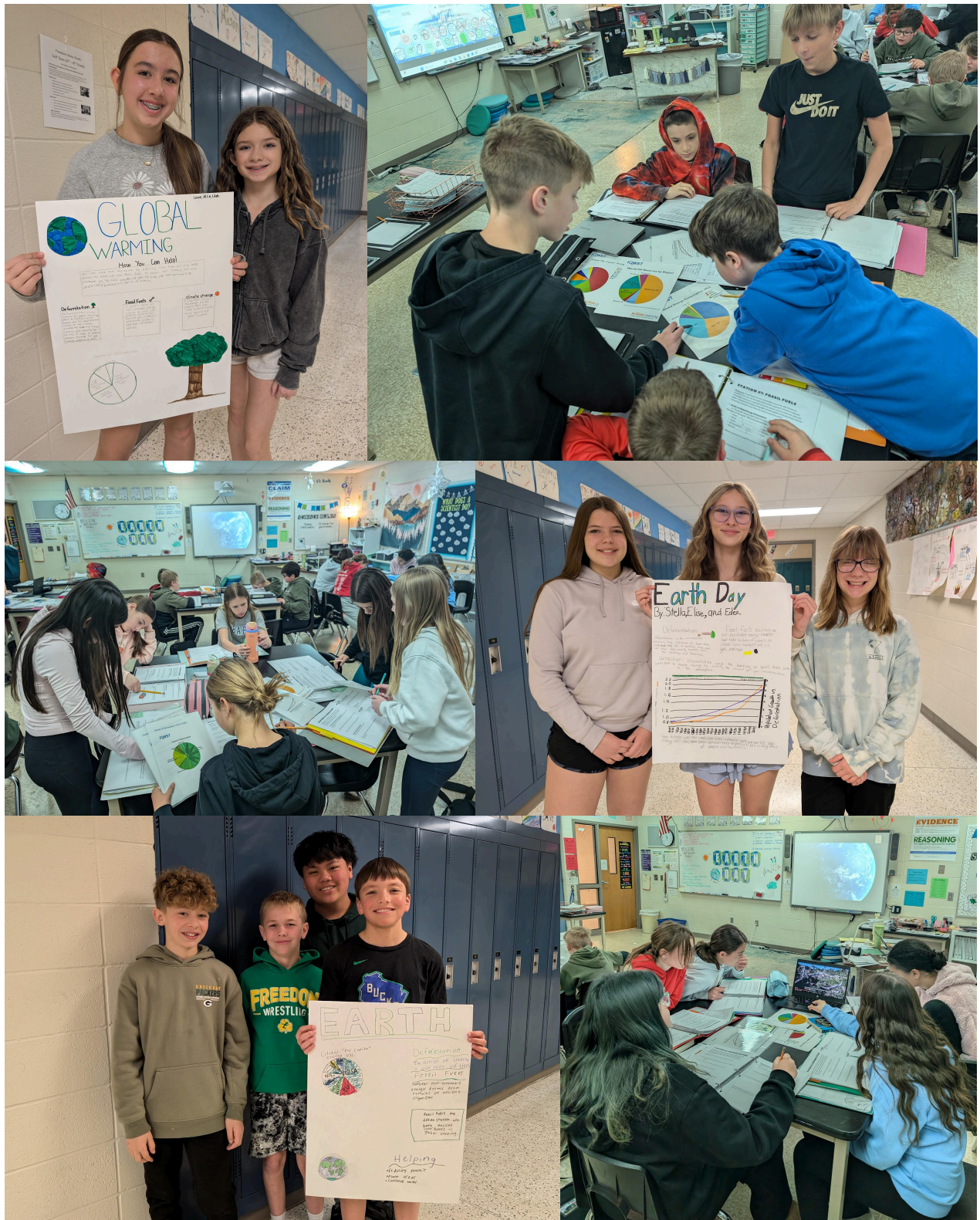


and participated in a Reader's theater:

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7th Grade News

7th Grade ELA -Writing

As we approach the end of the school year, students will be working through the argumentative writing unit. Students will finish up the whole-class argumentative letter regarding why Freedom should have a community pool then move on to the independent research letter. Students will receive sources, take notes, plan, and construct a letter regarding whether FASD should implement a four-day school week.

We will also finish our work with Patterns of Power taking the final test which covers compound-complex sentences, apostrophes, active/passive voice, and appositives.

We will end the year with our final exam. Students will have three days in class to complete a notes packet using all notes stored in their three-ring ELA binder this year. The notes packet can then be used on the final exam.

It has been a pleasure to work with the seventh grade class this year. I wish them well as they continue on their academic journey.

7th Grade ELA - Reading

With summer just around the corner, 7th grade readers are wrapping up their poetry unit—ending on a high note with *Out of the Dust* by Karen Hesse. This novel in verse has been a powerful way to explore poetic structure, voice, and emotion through storytelling.

To close out the semester, students will join book clubs, choosing from a variety of engaging novels and sharing rich discussions with their peers.

It's been a fantastic year of growth, and we're so proud of all their hard work. Happy summer and happy reading!

7th Grade Science

Greetings from 7th Grade Science. We are in our Ecological Dynamics unit of OpenSciEd. The focus question we will be addressing in this unit is, "How does changing an ecosystem affect what lives there?" We are currently researching an endangered species and presenting on our findings. We will then move into a case study investigating how Palm Oil Plantations in Indonesia are affecting the population of species that live naturally there, such as the Orangutan.

Bird migration is well underway. Keep your eyes open for returning swallows, sparrows, and warblers. The bird of the month is the Yellow-rumped Warbler. This is typically our first of several warblers to return. It is about the size of a sparrow and can be found in most woodlands foraging on insects at the tops of trees.

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7th Grade Math

I can't believe we are wrapping up the year already! The students will be exploring the last two units on Geometry and Statistics. Both of these units are a great way to end the year. They will be doing a lot of hands-on activities throughout both units. In Unit 7, students will learn about different types of angles and how they relate to each other. In addition, students will figure out how to create triangles with given measurements and explore 3D shapes like prisms. They will learn how to find surface area and volume. Unit 8 introduces chance and probability. Students will learn how to predict outcomes, run simple experiments, and understand how likely events are. They will learn how to collect and use samples to make guesses about larger groups.

7th Grade Social Studies

Hello, 7th Grade Parents!

Although it does not seem like it outside as I write this update, summer is quickly approaching. It will not be long, and the students will be sent home for the summer. Before we send them off, there is still some work to be done in Social Studies. We will cover U.S. History right up to the Civil War. In 8th grade Social Studies, Mr. Van Rossum will pick up where we left off this year.

I have had a blast teaching your children this year and can only hope they enjoyed Social Studies class as much. Maybe they even learned a thing or two. I hope you enjoy the rest of the school year.

Students will wrap up the year with a final book club unit, persuasive writing that leads to more kindness, and a vision for who each student is or hopes to be in the future. Our 8th graders are now ready to take on high school math with a strong foundation and a willingness to learn.

Exploratory Music

As the end of the school year comes into view, our exploration of music, culture, and instruments starts to wind down. As the year concludes, each grade will get the chance to look back at their favorite instruments and activities from our entire year of music making. Finally, we end our year with preparing the instruments for their storage over the summer months; knowing that in just a few short weeks we will again take them up and try to get a little smarter, and a little more musical, in the next school year!

Exploratory Spanish

In May, Cinco de Mayo (May 5) is celebrated by many Hispanic Americans as a day to celebrate their culture and heritage. Music, dancing and food are a huge part of the festivities. Special types of music such as Mariachi and folkloric dancing are customary along with a variety of delicious foods. Reminders for the school year-

- If vomiting/diarrhea- your student must be 24 hours vomiting/diarrhea free prior to returning to school/co-curriculars
- Fever of 100.4 or greater, your student will be sent home. Your student must be 24 hours fever free without the use of fever reduction medications prior to returning to school.
- All medication must be brought to school/picked up from school by a parent/guardian in its original container. This does include over the counter medications.
- Bring in your emergency medication forms and medications. If a medication is kept on person, a physician must indicate that in the letter/form.
- If there is a change in your student's health condition/diagnosis, physical restrictions, please let the nurse know. Phone is 920-788-7944.

A reminder to parents: at the end of the year-all medication needs to be picked up by a parent/guardian.

Any child with a health and/or emergency plan must have a new plan completed at the start of school.
