Welcome to Freedom Middle School, 6th Graders! Lots of pats right on the ol' backs for these students. Way to get acclimated quickly to middle school! We, now, know our way around the building and have been getting pretty good with our lockers

In Science, 6th graders have built and tested their solar ovens to see how light interacts with different mediums. They were excited to get these outside and make yummy s'mores in the process! In Social Studies, the 6th graders are studying geography which includes learning how to locate places using latitude and longitude, the six elements of geography, how human beings impact the environment, and how the environment impacts human beings. In ELA, we have been focusing on finding good fit books, understanding a purpose for our reading along with genres. Math has started a brand new curriculum, Illustrative Math. This has been a great transition. The students have been very engaged in the activities in class!

7th Grade News

ELA - Literacy: We are so excited to begin the year with our Realistic Fiction Unit! During this unit, we will dive into developing our skills in reading more complex fiction texts, analyzing characters, analyzing themes, and thinking critically about point of view and perspective, all while reading critically with questions in mind. This unit will have an emphasis on getting students to think and write critically about complex texts.

Social Studies: Hello everyone! My name is Mr. Gerritts, and I am teaching 7th grade U.S. History. I am so excited to be here in Freedom working with your children. I graduated from Freedom High School in 2001, so it certainly feels like I am coming home. In class, we have studied the Age of Exploration and the Columbian Exchange. If you can't remember anything about those topics from your 7th grade Social Studies class, you should ask your 7th grader. Go Irish!

Science: Greetings parents. My name is Ryan Atwater, and I am the 7 th grade science teacher. This is my 22nd year here at Freedom and my 19th teaching 7 th grade. We are off to a great start here in science. We have switched our online platform for science in themiddle school this year. We are now using OpenSciEd for our curriculum, which is part of the Einstein Project. It is a phenomenon/lab based program that has a lot of hands-on labs. We will be focusing on chemistry for the majority of quarter 1. I'm looking forward to a successful year with your children. 
ELA - Writing: Seventh graders are off to a good start in ELA - Writing finishing off the parts of speech review. They'll be using their knowledge of these parts of speech as we begin our daily work with Patterns of Power. In October, we'll work through subject and predicate. Students will also be working on narrative writing by constructing an autobiography that covers past events and brings them into the future! They'll draft, revise, edit, and produce a final copy.

Math:

Students have been doing a great job with our new Illustrative Mathematics curriculum. We are working through Unit 1 on Scaled Figures. The picture below is an example of a group sorting images to explore the ideas of scaled factors that are less than 1, equal to 1, or greater than 1.

8th Grade Math

Math 8 is off to a great start! As you have heard from your student, we are working with a new curriculum this year called Illustrative Math (IM). IM is a problem based curriculum where students spend their time in class working independently and collaboratively on carefully designed and sequenced problems. Students will collaborate with their peers by talking about math, listening to others' ideas, justifying their thought process, and critiquing the reasoning of others. During the month of September, students focused on transforming shapes and points in the coordinate plane. Students have learned to perform and describe translations (slide), rotations (spin), and reflections (flip).

8th Grade ELA

ELA students have been busy with choosing independent reading books and learning their page goals for each week. Students always have the ELA assignment to read for 20 minutes each night to ensure they are completing those goals. Each week they are scored on how many pages they have read out of their overall goal. Weekly goals are averaged together for a monthly Skyward grade. Take time to ask your students what they have been reading.

As we look forward, students will continue to work on a punctuation and sentence combining unit that teaches them to identify and utilize more complex sentences. These skills increase in difficulty, so challenge your students to show you some of their work. This unit moves into reading *The Outsiders* as a text to model many of those skills and work on literary analysis. Finally, they will include the sentence variety in a realistic fiction writing assessment.

Encore Classes

MS Spanish: Señora Zabel

Middle School Spanish is off to a GREAT start! Students can ask and answer basic questions such as How are you? Where are you from? What is your name? How old are you? They are working hard on learning numbers, basic commands and vocabulary. Even though Spanish may sound like a lot of work, we also have a lot of fun. Not only are students working hard at greetings and reviewing concepts, but they are also learning about Hispanic cultures. Students will learn about the Day of the Dead and will research the country of choice for our Flag Project. Our time is also filled with group activities, hands-on learning, competitions, trivia, and games.

Exploratory Music: Brandt

It's the most wonderful time of the year...wait...wrong song. All the same, our time in exploratory music is off to a great start! Each grade level has begun their opening units: 6th on instrument families, 7th on piano, and 8th on guitars. On top of our instrument playing, our older grades have begun the process of researching more about their favorite artists. Who are they as people? Why do they make the music they do? What influences them? These are all questions we hope to answer as we connect the music we study in class with the music students listen to outside of school.

Reminders for the school year-

- If vomiting/diarrhea- your student must be 24 hours vomiting/diarrhea free prior to returning to school/co-curriculars
- Fever of 100.4 or greater, your student will be sent home. Your student must be 24 hours fever free without the use of fever reduction medications prior to returning to school.
- All medication must be brought to school/picked up from school by a parent/guardian
- Bring in your emergency medication forms and medications. If a medication is kept on person, a physician must indicate that in the letter/form.
