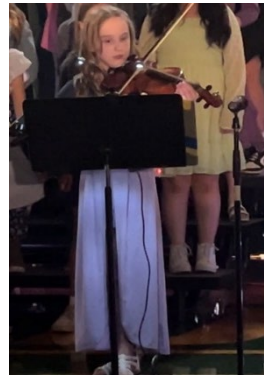

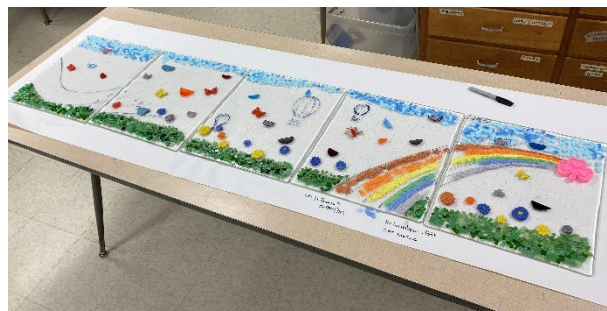

5 Summer Activities to Boost Reading Fluency

❶ Partner Reading

Read with your child and discuss what good fluency sounds like! Model fluent reading by taking turns reading pages, echo reading, choral reading, or doing fill-in-the-blank.

Read books, poems, partner plays... anything that gets your child reading aloud. If you don't have time to read with him/her every day, have your child read aloud to a buddy (e.g., sibling, friend, pet, or even a stuffed animal.)

❷ On-the-Go Fluency Bag

Create your own "on-the-go" fluency bag to bring with you on your summer adventures. Fill it with independent-level books, poems, or fluency cards. Before your child leaves the house, car, or dinner table, have him/her pick a piece of text from the bag to read aloud with good fluency. Encourage multiple readings of the same text to help with smooth reading and automatic recognition of words.

❸ Fluency Games

Turn everyday games, like Chutes & Ladders, Candyland, Go Fish, and Tic-Tac-Toe, into fluency fun! Each player must read a piece of text or a fluency card aloud before taking a turn. The goal is to practice applying all the components of fluency with games you already know how to play. You can even use blank game boards to create your own fluency games! (Visit bit.ly/FluencyWordCards for fluency card ideas.)

❹ Poem of the Week





Pick a poem to read with your child each week of the summer. On Monday, model reading the poem with good fluency and have your child echo read each line of the poem. Then, have him/her practice reading the poem aloud each day of the week. On Friday, have him/her perform the poem for your or the entire family! You can even record the before/after to reflect on progress.

❺ Song Lyrics

Have your child pick their favorite songs and print the lyrics using AZLyrics.com. Listen to the song and silently read the lyrics along with the music artist. Practice reading aloud with and without the music, focusing on rhythm to guide his/her fluency. Make sure your child is reading the lyrics and not reciting from memory. You can also do family-style karaoke to practice fluency with music!
