Battle of the Books

The Battle of the Books school-wide competition will be held on Wednesday, February 7, 2018 and with the busy holiday season upon us, that's just around the corner. I have been quizzing many eager fourth and fifth grade *Battle* competitors after school at our meetings. I will continue holding meetings on **Thursdays** after school until the battle. If students would like to stay on Thursday as a group to work with me, they may do so, but they must have signed parent permission to stay. (This should have been communicated in the permission slip that was sent home before break.) Parents, please encourage your students to keep reading, to share their books with you, and to stop in to Room 212 to get geared up for the February competition. The students are working hard memorizing titles, authors, characters, and events for each of the 15 novels and the 5 picture books.

As I have told the students, the format of the test in February will require that students accurately identify the correct book title and author after students are given a clue with the specific character, setting, or plot descriptions. They must give the complete title and author's complete name in order to get credit for the answer. All *Battle of the Books* members must be present on **February 7, 2018** in order to compete in the school-wide competition, so mark your calendars! There is no make-up date. The Battle of the Books team that will represent Freedom Elementary will compete in an online, state-wide competition during the last week in February 2018. Freedom Elementary has had a terrific showing the past several years and we have so many great, enthusiastic teams this year! We certainly want to continue this tradition and we look forward to February! Happy reading!
