Freedom High School has their 2016-2017 registration dates set for Tuesday, August 16 from 1:00pm-7:00pm and Wednesday, August 17 from 8:00am-5:00pm

Registrar General Information

Our online registration will open on August 1st.

If you would like to do it online and pay in person you can do the online portion at home and come into school and pay on August 16th or 17th.

If you would like assistance doing the online registration you can come in and we will have people to help you take care of doing the online registration on August 16th or 17th.

If you do your online registration at home and just need to pay in person please remember to print your receipt and have it with you on August 16th or 17th or you can print it at the school.

If you need to do all of your online registration you will need go to the gym on August 16th or 17th and one of our workers will help you. When you are done either pay online and print a receipt or simply print a receipt and take it to the lobby to pay the cashier.

If you have done registration at home and paid online and just need to pick up athletic passes, parking passes, phy ed uniforms, make sure you have your receipt and on August 16th or 17th and you will be able to pick up these items. This also will apply to anyone that pays in person you will need receipt verifying payment of these items to pick them up. Anyone picking up a PE Shorts (MS/HS only) Activity Passes (Adult & ES students on family passes) or Parking Passes (HS only) MUST have a PAID receipt with them to get these items.

Middle School and High School students that have purchased an athletic pass will not need a paper one picked up as it will be automatically printed on their ID when getting their pictures taken at registration as long as they have a paid receipt. Only adults and elementary students on a family pass will be issued paper athletic passes.

Middle School/High School ONLY - Photographers are located in the lecture hall and are accessible through the back door in the hallway. All students will be getting pictures taken and ID cards printed on site. If they getting an activity pass to be put on the card they will need to have with them a receipt for this

to be printed on their card. If they do not have a paid receipt that states they paid for a activity pass they will not have it on their ID card. Elementary pictures will be taken after school starts.

Middle School/High School ONLY - Locker numbers and combinations for Middle School and High School can be found on their skyward account. Locker combinations do not show up on the phone app you must log in on a computer to see these. These will not be available until after August 1st.

If you need a hard copy of your schedule for MS/HS they will be available to pick up after the registration process is complete and paid for. These schedules will be available at the cashiers table.

High School ONLY – The agenda’s will be sold during registration on August 16th & 17th for High School Students only.
