


#### **Wisconsin Forward Exam Grades 3-5**

What is the Wisconsin Forward Exam? Students will take the Wisconsin Forward Exam between March 20-April 28. This assessment will be used to gauge how well students are mastering the Wisconsin State Standards. The Forward Exam is given at:

- \*Grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics
- \*Grades 4 and 8 in Science and,
- \*Grades 4, 8, and 10 in Social Studies

To celebrate, we are reading *A Bear Called Paddington* by Michael Bond. We will also have a reading month calendar for each student. As students complete the activities or read the chapters in the book, they can cross off those days.
