


Principal's Corner


Third Quarter & Staff Appreciation

March is Reading Month at Freedom Elementary!

To celebrate, we are reading *Dog Days* by Karen English school-wide. Each week an email will be sent to read along with the staff. We will also have a reading month calendar for each student. As students complete the activities or read the chapters in the book, they can cross off those days. At the end of the month, students who have completed at least 12 activities, should bring their signed calendar back to school to earn a reading month prize!





Summer School

Summer School Information will be available on the website prior to Spring Break. Please check out the following features when starting to register your child:

1. Printable summer school sports flyers- will be available on the summer school website in the near future
2. All course descriptions/schedule are listed.

Reminders-The session will be three weeks: *June 8 through June 26, 2026*. Online Registrations Window (April 7 - April 24, 2026), final day to pay course fees is **Friday, May 1, 2026**.

If your child is signed up for a course when the registration window closes, you are responsible for those course fees whether or not your child attends summer school.

Reading Fluency

Fluency is one of the five foundational reading skills. (The other four, as you likely know, are phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, and comprehension.) Fluency connects readers not just to words, but to emotions and expressions, characters and connotations. And it's also where reading really starts to foster joy.

When readers develop fluency, they also develop:

- **Comprehension.** As decoding becomes more effortless, readers can focus on understanding meaning. Fluent readers recognize words automatically, allowing them to dedicate cognitive resources to complex sentence structures and connections among ideas. They grasp both main points and nuances. All told, they get what they're reading.
- **Confidence.** Fluent readers are more likely to feel accomplished, proud, and motivated with regards to their reading abilities. And it's a virtuous cycle: As their confidence grows, they're more likely to engage in and enjoy reading – and continue to improve.
- **Vocabulary.** Fluency plays a significant role in vocabulary acquisition and language development. Fluent readers encounter a larger variety of words in context. This exposure enhances their language and communication skills across academic topics and life experiences.
- **Academic success.** Fluency helps students read to learn. As students advance through school, fluency becomes increasingly important for comprehension and analysis of more advanced and content-rich texts.
- **Emotional connection.** Fluency enables readers to connect with the characters, emotions, experiences, and implications in a given text. That's what makes reading immersive and enjoyable – in the moment and for a lifetime.

From the Health Room

1. Parents/guardians must drop off and pick up **ALL** medications. This includes cough drops, OTC medications, inhalers, eye drops, etc.
2. All prescription and over-the-counter medications must be brought in their original container. If it is a prescription, the label must be on the medication.
3. Students cannot have medications in their backpacks **UNLESS** there is a completed health form and the provider indicates they can carry the medication themselves.
4. The medication policy and all medication or health forms can be found on the Freedom School District website or can be picked up at the school.
