
Wisconsin Forward Exam Grades 3-5

What is the Wisconsin Forward Exam? Students will take the Wisconsin Forward Exam between March 18-April 26. This assessment will be used to gauge how well students are mastering the Wisconsin State Standards. The Forward Exam is given at:

- *Grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics
- *Grades 4 and 8 in Science and.
- *Grades 4, 8, and 10 in Social Studies

March is Reading Month at Freedom Elementary!

To celebrate, we are reading *Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing* by Judy Blume schoolwide. Each week an email will be sent to read along with the staff. We will also have a reading month calendar for each student. As students complete the activities or read the chapters in the book, they can cross off those days. 
READING WITH YOUR CHILD
