School Start Time Reminder and Appointments

School begins at 8:00 am. If students arrive after 8:00 am they are considered tardy. Each tardy is equivalent to an absence. Please remember to call in your child's absence daily when they are sick. If your child goes to an appointment, it will be excused if you bring in a note.

School Fees

If you have not paid your school fees for this year, you can go on e-funds to pay these or you can bring them to the office. 4K is \$30.00 and Kindergarten through Grade 5 is \$35.00. The Technology Fee for grades K-5 is \$15.00. Milk Fee (optional for grades K-5). The cost is \$50.00 for the year. The cost for Early Childhood and 4Kindergarten milk break is \$25.00.

Battle of the Books (B.o.B.) Sign Up

Who: Open to readers in grades 4 and 5. Students can form teams of up to four readers per team. If a student is unable to form a team, we can assign him/her to a team.

What: The statewide Battle of the Books program is designed to promote a love of reading among our

students. It encourages students to read a variety of books while remembering information about the plots, characters, and settings of the books. Every question asked in a battle is answered by the title and author of the book and takes the form of: Name the book in which a horse and a boy are stranded on an island. It is a fun, academic-based competition that has been very successful in school districts throughout the state in encouraging students to read.

How: Students will read 20 books, and then practice answering questions based on those books. We will provide books to loan out to students. By the end of January we will choose the top readers to form a team to compete in the state competition.



HOW PARENTS CAN SUPPORT READING AT HOME

GATHER THE PIECES

Access to a wide range of books

Reading-friendly physical spaces to read

Mental space to read (e.g., 'boredom')

Time to read (access, opportunity, schedule, reduced alternatives, etc.)

Consider reading apps for increased access to certain reading forms, authors, etc.



START WITH THE CHILD

Their interests (as a person)

Their preferences (reading forms and genres)

Their reading strengths and areas for growth

Their own unique identity as a reader (that may be different than what you had in mind)

GROW A CULTURE

Let them 'catch you' reading (books)

Read out loud to them (and if they want to, let them read out loud to you)

Consider 'DEAR' times (Drop Everything And Read)

The 'Why' of reading: connecting what you read to what you think about and how you live

Focus on the big idea: growing children who read because they want to
