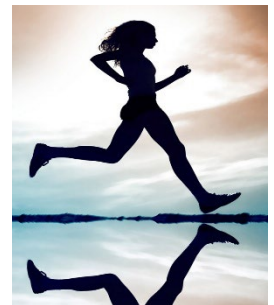

Here's a brief summary of what we've been learning about in the music room here at FES as well as a few sneak peeks at things we are looking forward to in November.

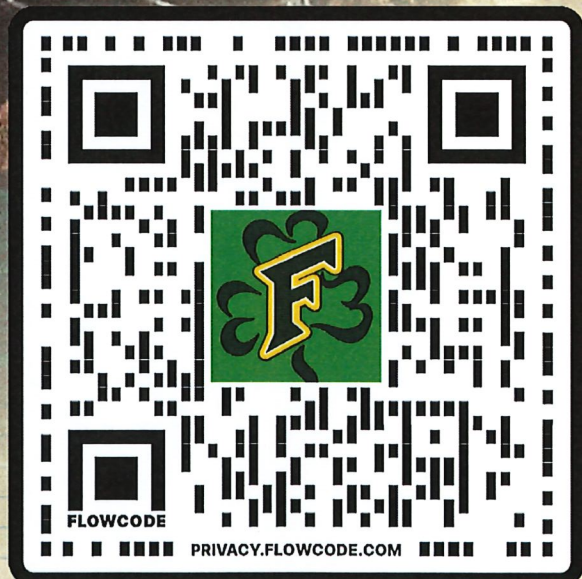

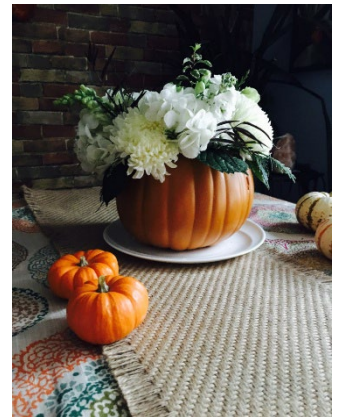

Parents with High Expectations Reading Fluency Matters



In order to be a good reader, your child must be able to do two things:

- 1) make sense of, or “decode,” the words on the page; and,
- 2) understand what the words mean when joined in a sentence.

Early reading instruction focuses on teaching a child how to read single words, but being good at reading single words is not the only skill your child needs. Once your child has become good at decoding and reading single words, he or she needs to learn to read easily, becoming an effective reader.

Good readers have moved beyond decoding single words well. They can understand what they are reading. This is the ultimate goal for reading.

- Good readers read quickly and accurately.
- They can read with expression.
- They tend to separate sentences into groups of words based on the meaning.
- They also tend to read many individual words automatically.

It is hard to understand what you are reading when you are not a good reader. Researchers believe that everyone has a limited ability to pay attention when learning a new task. So, if your child needs to use a lot of attention to decode or read single words, there is little left over to use for understanding what he or she has read. Once decoding or reading single words becomes automatic, attention can then be turned to meaning. Good readers can begin to enjoy the meaning of what they read. They can move beyond learning to read. Then can now read to learn.

Reading Fluency Matters La fluidez en la lectura es importante

(Promising Practices: Helping Your Child Read and Understand - Spanish)

Para poder ser un buen lector, su hijo debe tener la habilidad de hacer dos cosas:

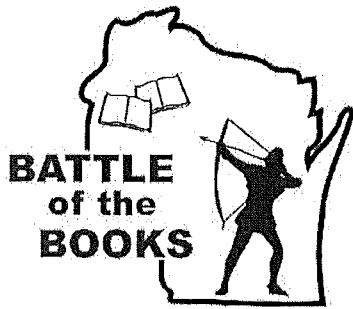
- 1) Hacer sentido o “descifrar” las palabras en una página y,
- 2) entender el significado de las palabras cuando están unidas en una frase

La instrucción de lectura temprana se enfoca en enseñar a un niño cómo leer palabras individuales. Pero ser bueno para leer palabras solas no es la única destreza que su niño necesita. Una vez que su hijo se ha hecho bueno para descifrar palabras solas, él o ella necesitan aprender a leer con facilidad, convirtiéndose en un lector eficaz.

Los buenos lectores han ido más allá de poder decodificar bien palabras individuales. Ellos pueden comprender lo que están leyendo y esto es la meta fundamental de poder leer.

- Los buenos lectores leen rápidamente y con precisión.
- Ellos pueden leer con expresión.
- Ellos tienden a separar las oraciones en grupos de palabras basadas en su significado.
- Ellos también tienden a leer muchas palabras individuales automáticamente.

Es difícil entender qué es lo que se está leyendo cuando no se es un lector con fluidez. Los investigadores creen que todo mundo tiene una habilidad limitada para prestar atención cuando se está aprendiendo una tarea nueva. Así que si su hijo necesita usar mucha atención para decodificar palabras individuales, le sobra muy poca atención para comprender lo que está leyendo. Una vez que la decodificación se ha hecho automática, la atención puede entonces enfocarse en la comprensión del significado. Los niños que leen con fluidez pueden empezar a disfrutar el significado de lo que leen. Ellos pueden pasar de aprender a leer a leer para aprender.



Battle of the Books (B.o.B.) Sign Up

Who: Open to readers in grades 4 and 5. In the beginning of February advisors will form a team of four students with one alternate based on comprehension of all 20 books. This team will then compete against other teams within the state.

What: The statewide Battle of the Books program is designed to promote a love of reading among our students. It encourages students to read a variety of books while remembering information about the plots, characters, and settings of the books. Every question asked in a battle is answered by the title and author of the book and takes the form of: *Name the book in which a horse and a boy are stranded on an island.* It is a fun, academic-based competition that has been very successful in school districts throughout the state in encouraging students to read.

How: Students will read 20 books, and then practice answering questions based on those books. We will provide books to loan out to students. In the second week of February we will choose the top readers to form a team to compete in the state competition.

When: Students will meet during the 5th grade lunch period (12:05-12:25) in Mrs. Presteen's room to practice questions with our first meeting scheduled Tuesday, November 13, 2025. Permission slip: (please return the completed bottom portion of the back side of this letter). Students may begin checking out books from Mr. Awe and Mrs. Presteen as soon as they have their permission slips handed in, even before our official start date. Students may also use the Sora app to begin listening to titles.
