Also, the Freedom Middle School and High School Band will be performing their annual concert on October 31 for our students too. We will continue to send email information weekly as necessary. Conference Scheduling and Parent/Teacher Conferences

Conferences will be scheduled through Skyward. The conference window will be open until October 2 at 9:00 am. Conferences are October 4 & 5. They are 3:30-6:45 pm for Kindergarten through Grade 5 and 8:00 am – 6:45 pm for 4Kindergarten.

Scholastic Book Fair

The Scholastic Book Fair will be held on **Wednesday, October 4** and **Thursday, October 5 from 3:30 – 6:45 in the elementary library**. This event is held on the same nights as **Parent-Teacher Conferences**. Please come visit us and find some great books for your children! This fundraiser helps us to purchase more books, AV and library supplies. Your support is greatly appreciated!

Appointments

A reminder, if your child has an appointment or sees a doctor when they are ill, please ask the provider for a doctor's note to excuse your child from school. This note is very important in reporting accurate attendance. If you do not provide a doctor's note, it will be considered an absence within your 10 day limit.

Dismissal Time – 3:05 p.m.

Our students in Grades Kindergarten through Grade 5 are required to stay a full day at school. If you need to pick up your child early, please report to the school office. Our teachers are not allowed to dismiss a student to a parent; only the office staff may release them. Please wait by the gym when you pick your child up at the end of the day. The doors open up at 3:00 pm.

We prefer you send a note but if you need to call, please do so **before 2:00 p.m.** to pick up your child at the end of the day.

We have over 700 students and many parents call with special requests which are very difficult to juggle at the end of the school day. Please **send a note** when there is a change for your child in transportation. Also, make arrangements outside of school for gatherings and birthdays.

Reminders

Classroom Visitors

If you would like to visit your child's classroom, please contact your child's classroom teacher in advance to set up a time. There are times of the day that are more conducive to having a visitor in the classroom. Contacting classroom teachers in advance helps to ensure that all students will have a comfortable learning environment. While parents coming to eat lunch with their child do not need preapproval, we do ask that all parents make prearrangements before coming to school to visit classrooms. Just a reminder we do not allow parents on our playgrounds. We appreciate your understanding as we all work together to educate each student and are mindful of student confidentiality.

Drop Off & Pick Up

Parents please do not pull out in the bus lanes before or after school when dropping off or picking up your child. If you are bringing your child to school, in your car, we are asking that you park your car and walk your child into school using the painted walk way. This will help stop the congestion on Highway E in front of the school. Busses cannot drop children off if there are so many cars blocking their way. Reminder: we do not have supervision until 7:35 a.m. Please do not drop off prior to 7:35 a.m. The school day begins at 8:00 a.m. Any student arriving after 8:00 a.m. will be marked tardy.

Students in Grades Kindergarten through Grade 5 will be dismissed on **Friday, October 6 at 12:15 p.m.** due to an afternoon Teacher/Staff Inservice.
