Student Drop Off/Pick Up Procedure

Student Drop Off Starts at 7:35 am.

Please continue to utilize the car drop offline in the morning. Parents need to pull as far forward as possible before unloading. If possible, students should exit the vehicle from the passenger side. Students will enter through the main doors of the school. If you choose to park, please walk your child to the door. Thank you for your patience with the morning drop off. Remember students should not exit vehicles before 7:35 am.

Student Pick Up-

Please remember we DO NOT have a pickup line at the end of the day. You need to park **legally** in the parking lot or on the primary playground past the shed. Parents need to come to the pickup area to collect their child(ren). The playground parking will open at 2:50 pm for additional parking. Please plan accordingly.

School Hours

The school day begins at **8:00 a.m.** for Freedom Elementary School. Students should be in class and ready to learn by 7:55 a.m. All children must be dismissed through the school office if leaving outside of our normal dismissal time. Registration and Fees

Registration was done on-line again this year. Please contact the elementary office if you haven't completed it and need assistance. Please take care of any outstanding balances. Milk Break for 4K is \$25.00 and milk break for K-5 is \$50.00.

Lunch

Lunches for students in 4K through grade 1 will cost \$2.55. Students in grades 2 through 5 the cost will be \$2.65. Reduced lunches cost \$0.40.

Breakfast prices are \$1.35. Reduced breakfast prices are \$.35. Breakfast is available before school until 8:00 am.

If your student brings a lunch from home and needs a milk, the family account will be charged \$0.35.



How Will My Child Learn Math This Year?

Your child's classroom will use Bridges in Mathematics second edition, a comprehensive curriculum for grades K–5. Bridges is a rigorous program designed to address the new math standards in a way that's enjoyable and accessible to all learners.

The curriculum focuses on developing in students a deep understanding of math concepts, proficiency with key skills, and the ability to solve new and complex problems. Learning activities tap into the intelligence and strengths all students have by presenting mathematically powerful material alive with language, pictures, and movement.

Students in a Bridges classroom talk about math, describe observations, explain methods, and ask questions. They are encouraged to find multiple ways to solve problems and show different ways of thinking. This is a vital way to help students build more flexible and efficient ways to solve increasingly complex problems. Hands-on activities engage them in exploring, developing, testing, discussing, and applying mathematical concepts.

How Is the Program Structured?

Bridges features a combination of whole-group, small-group, and independent activities that are problem centered.

Problems & Investigations

Problems & Investigations often begin with a problem posed to the whole class. Students think and work independently or talk in pairs before sharing and comparing strategies and solutions as a whole class. The teacher monitors and guides the class discussion to make sure that students understand important mathematical concepts.

Work Places

Work Places are engaging math exploration activities that reinforce key skills. The teacher observes and interacts to address students' need for support and enrichment.


Number Corner

Number Corner is a skill-building program that revolves around the classroom calendar and gives students an active role. They receive daily practice as well as steady encounters with broader mathematical concepts.

Homework

Home Connections assignments are sent home at the discretion of your child's teacher. At times, your child may bring home math games or activities for you to enjoy together, but the main role for parents is not to teach but to guide your student and take an interest in their work. You'll be receiving Unit Overviews throughout the year that explain the math concepts the class is currently focused on and suggest specific ways you may support your child.





¿Cómo aprenderá matemáticas mi hijo este año?

La clase de su hijo utilizará Bridges in Mathematics segunda edición, un plan de estudios integral para los grados de K-5. Bridges es un programa riguroso diseñado para tratar los nuevos estándares matemáticos de manera que sea divertido y accesible para todos los educandos.

El plan de estudios se enfoca en el desarrollo en estudiantes con una comprensión profunda de los conceptos matemáticos, destreza con las habilidades clave y la capacidad para resolver problemas nuevos y complejos. involucran en la exploración, desarrollo, pruebas, discusión y aplicación de conceptos matemáticos.

¿Cómo está estructurado el programa?

Bridges presenta una combinación de actividades de grupo entero, grupos pequeños y actividades independientes que se centran en un problema.

Problemas e investigaciones

Los problemas e investigaciones con frecuencia empiezan con un problema que se presenta a toda la clase. Los estudiantes piensan y trabajan de forma independiente o hablan en pares antes de compartir y comparar estrategias y soluciones como clase. El maestro supervisa y guía la discusión en clase para asegurarse de que los estudiantes comprendan los conceptos matemáticos importantes.

Work Places

Work Places son interesantes actividades de exploración matemática que refuerzan las habilidades clave. El maestro observa e interactúa para encargarse de la necesidad de los estudiantes de apoyo y enriquecimiento.

Number Corner

Number Corner es un programa de generación de habilidades que se desenvuelve alrededor de un calendario de clases y da a los estudiantes un papel activo. Reciben prácticas diarias así como también encuentros constantes con conceptos matemáticos más amplios.

Tarea

Las tareas Home Connections se envían a casa a discreción del maestro de su hijo. En algún momento, su hijo llevará a casa juegos o actividades matemáticas para que disfruten juntos, pero la función principal para los padres no es enseñar sino guiar a su estudiante y tomar interés en sus trabajos. Recibirá Síntesis de las unidades durante todo el año que explican los conceptos matemáticos en que actualmente se enfoca la clase y le sugieren maneras específicas para apoyar a su hijo.
