Strategies to Boost Reading Fluency

All early readers stumble over words at first, but polishing those reading skills will benefit their learning in every subject area. There are some steps you can take to help set them up to have lifelong reading success. Reading fluency is the ability to read out loud accurately, at a good pace (not too slow *or* too fast), and with expression. Reading fluency helps contribute to higher achievement and success in reading comprehension. Using these reading strategies can help set them up for success in reading.

1. Model fluent reading.

The more often they hear fluent reading, the easier it will be to pick it up. Try the "I read, then you read" method while using exuberant and Oscar-worthy expressions as you pause at commas and stop at periods. Audiobooks in the car or on an ipad are also a great way to fit in reading when you are on the go.

2. Teach your child how to track words.

Tracking, or running your finger under words as you read them comes in handy when trying to decipher where one word ends and the next begins (especially when reading speaking parts with multiple characters). Feel free to use a post it note, colored note card, or a bookmark as a reading tracker to help hold their attention and place while reading.

3. Try choral reading together.

Choral reading simply means you read a story out loud, and ask your child to read along with you at the same pace. Pick a book that they can already read themselves, this way they can focus on pacing and accuracy rather than decoding new words. Reading along with you at the same pace lets them experience how fluent reading feels and what it sounds like.

4. Focus on sight words.

Certain words known as sight words, are words that are not decodable by sounding them out phonetically. They often overlap with high-frequency words, or those that appear most often in reading. Children that can instantly recognize these words won't have to spend valuable reading time trying to sound them out. Teaching sight words as a game can be a fun way to memorize them. Spell the words out with magnetic letters, or put some sight words on note cards and ask your child to splat the correct word with a fly swatter when you say it.

5. Read to a friendly audience

Some kids really don't like to read in front of other people because it makes them uncomfortable or nervous. If you set out their favorite stuffed animals or even have them read to the family pet this would help aide with practice using pitch, tone, expression and volume. These are necessary skills for children as they read silently to themselves later on that will be essential for comprehension.

6. Record, evaluate, and repeat.

Have your child record their reading on an iPad. Listen to it together and see if they would like to record again. Set a goal ahead of time so they can work on expression, pace, tone, or volume. Parents are often concerned with getting their kids ahead in reading, but reading a little bit easier texts can be very helpful because it increases fluency, improves automaticity, and boosts confidence and leads to higher success in overall reading skills.
