
*Grades 3-8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics

*Grades 4 and 8 in Science and,

*Grades 4, 8, and 10 in Social Studies

Immunization Requirements 2021-2022

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) two doses Grades Kindergarten through 12

Varicella (Chickenpox) second dose phase Grades Kindergarten through 12

Tdap (Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis Booster)

Entering Grade 6

There is an exception to the Tdap requirement: Students who received a dose of tetanus or diphtheria vaccine within **5 years** of entering a grade for which Tdap is required are not required to receive Tdap vaccine.



HELPING YOUR CHILD WITH READING AT HOME

1. READ WHAT WE'RE READING

- Read the book with your child.
- Ask your child to retell the story.

2. ASK QUESTIONS

- Ask questions before, during, and after your child reads.
- Ask open-ended questions about the story.

3. READ ALOUD TO YOUR CHILD

- Even 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders love being read to.
- This can build their oral comprehension skills.

4. HAVE YOUR CHILD READ ALOUD TO YOU

- Try this on a short 15-minute drive.
- This can improve their fluency and expression.

5. HAVE YOUR CHILD READ EVERYTHING


- Recipes and instruction booklets are a good choice.
- This can expose your child to new vocabulary words.


6. LET THEM LISTEN TO AUDIOBOOKS

- These encourage visualization and imagination.
- Look online and at the library for free audio books.

7. SET ASIDE TIME TO READ EACH DAY

Carve out at least 15 non-negotiable minutes and make it a family event.











