## Principal's Corner

Dear Parents/Guardians,
We just completed the first month of school. It is exciting to see the students getting back into the routines of school.

We will again be doing Halloween at FES this year. We will have students come to school on Monday, October 31 with their costume already on. We ask that students do not wear Halloween masks to school. We will be having classroom parties, but remember snacks must be NUT FREE. Please do not send any baked goods unless it is packaged with a made in a nut free facility label.

We have started a "grab and go" breakfast option. Unfortunately, it will not be free this year. Please talk to your child if you do not want them taking breakfast at school.

Please take a minute to read the parent information in the newsletter on Standards-Based Report Cards. We will no longer be giving A, B, C grades in K-5. We will continue standards based report cards for K-2 and will be implementing it now in grades 3-5 this year. Again, on behalf of the FES staff, we appreciate your support as we continue through the 2022-2023 school year.


## Scheduling for Parent/Teacher Conferences

Conferences will be scheduled through Skyward. The conference window will be open from October 7 until October 17 at 9:00 am. Parent/Teacher Conferences are October 18 and October 19. They are 3:306:30 pm for 4Kindergarten through Grade 5.

## Appointments

A reminder, if your child has an appointment or sees a doctor when they are ill, please ask the provider for a doctor's note to excuse your child from school. This note is very important in reporting accurate attendance. If you do not provide a doctor's note, it will be considered an absence within your 10-day limit.

## Reminder:

- Parents need to send a note or call before 2:00 p.m. if there is a change to pick up for your children.
- We have over 700 students and many parents call with special requests which are very difficult to juggle at the end of the school day. Please send a note when there is a change for your child in transportation. Students may not ride a different bus again this year.
- School fees need to be paid if you haven't done it already. K-5 is $\$ 35.00$ and 4 K is $\$ 30.00$. K-5 Tech Fee is $\$ 15.00$.
- Reminder - milk at milk break is $\$ 44.00$ for the year for K-5 students. Milk Break for 4 K students is $\$ 22.00$. Students will not be able to take milk at milk break if this fee isn't paid by October 1.



## Attendance Reminders

Regular attendance and promptness are essential requirements for success in school. Our Policy

Please call the Elementary School Office at 920-788-7950 by 8:00 a.m. if your child is absent. The school line is open 24 hours a day, to report absences.

- If your child is reported absent by the classroom teacher and you have not notified us that he/she is not coming to school, one of the school secretaries will be calling your home and/or work.
- The purpose of this is:
- To determine and verify absence.
- For your child's safety---for example, if a child is expected to be at school and does not arrive for some reason, the parent would not be aware of this until it is time for the child to arrive home.
- Because we are concerned for your child's well-being, health and safety.
- Wisconsin Truancy Law requires a parent verification stating the exact reason for the absence in order for absences to be considered as excused. Habitual unexcused absences can lead to truancy.
- According to Wisconsin State Statute, a student who is excused in writing by his/her parent/guardian before an absence occurs will be excused from school, but a student may not be excused for more than ten (10) days in the school year.
- In order to not affect cumulative attendance, please provide a doctor's note whenever possible.
- An absence is defined as "part or all of a day" not in school during the designated hours of 8:00 am to 3:05 pm.
- Students are considered tardy when arriving after 8:00am. This does count as an absence.

## Nurse's Corner

## Prescription Medication



Forms need to be filled out by the physician and the parent/guardian allowing school personnel to give the medication and brought in by the parent/guardian on the first day that the medication is to be given at school.

The original medication bottle from the pharmacy shall be given to school personnel for dispensing to the student. The label on the bottle shall contain the name and telephone number of the pharmacy, the student's name, name of physician, medication name, and the dosage to be given. With any refill of medication, a newly updated medication bottle is required from the pharmacy.

All prescription medication must be brought to school by the parent/guardian. When the medication is discontinued or at the end of the year, the parent/guardian is responsible for picking up the medication. If the medication is not picked up within two weeks after school is out or medicine is discontinued, the medication will be properly discarded.

## Non-Prescription Medication

The non-prescription medication must be supplied by the student's parent/guardian in the manufacturer's package and the package must list the ingredients and recommended therapeutic dose in a legible format. School personnel may administer any drug which may lawfully be sold over the counter, without a prescription, to a student with the written consent and written instructions given by the parent/guardian.
*Please update the district nurse akazik@freedomschools.k12.wi.us regarding any health updates/concerns for your student.
*Please return emergency forms with ordered meds.

## What is a standards-based report card?

A standards-based report card lists the most important skills a student should learn in each subject at a particular grade level. Instead of letter grades, each student will be scored based upon their mastery of skills for a subject or content area.

## How will each student be scored?

Each student will receive a number score based on the proficiency scale below for each grading period.

| Exceeding | 4 | Exceeding the grade level standard or expectation. Producing quality <br> work consistently. |

## What are the standards?

The standards are skills that students should know and be able to do by the end of each grade.
For example: Count to 100 by 1's in kindergarten
Retell stories including the main idea and details in 1st grade

## Why are Lifelong Learning Skills a subject on the report card?

Lifelong Learning Skills are essential areas we work on consistently within a school day. These skills focus on a student's social behavior related to academic achievement, independent skills and peer relations. These skills will be the same from kindergarten to second grade.

## When will the new report cards start?

Grades Kindergarten through second started last school year 2021-2022. This school year ALL FES students in grades Kindergarten through fifth grade will be using the standards-based report card.
